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### LESSON #1 = Loving Authentically: Love With Genuineness

<u>Introduction</u>: The Bible is full of love stories (i.e. Jacob/Rachel, Boaz/Ruth, Joseph/Mary, etc.), because the Bible is the "Book of Love." John introduces an extraordinary concept when he adds that "God *IS* Love" (**I John 4:8**). We need to consider how to love with an authentic and genuine love. We need to love like God (**John 3:16**). Let's study together...

Why does God let us see the entire scheme of redemption?

<u>Conclusion</u>: We understand what it means to be lost and know the joy of being found! This love story is THE GREATEST LOVE STORY EVER TOLD and you are the star! Each of us are playing an important role in this story. God wants to love us! Do you love like Him? Will you follow God with genuineness and authenticity? Let's pursue this amazing love!



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# LESSON #2 = Loving Biblically: Love Like God Desires

<u>Introduction</u>: The words of Jesus are very clear: "If you love Me, keep My commandments" (**John 14:15**). This sentiment was echoed throughout the Old Testament, but it is made clearer in the New Testament. The disciples of Jesus taught this to the church with the same zeal and enthusiasm. In fact, the beloved disciple John said, "And this is His commandment: that we should believe on the name of His Son Jesus Christ and love one another, as He gave us commandment" (**I John 3:23**). Faith is the first step (**Romans 10:17**, **Hebrews 11:1**, **6**), but putting faith in action is essential. How can we love biblically? How can we love the way God desires? The answer is given by the apostle Paul in **I Corinthians 13**. Let's study together...

We have noticed in this series that we must follow God emotionally (heart), spiritually (soul), mentally (mind), physically (strength), socially (neighbor) and personally (yourself). However, we need to go the extra mile! What about loving our enemies (**Matthew 5:43-48**)? How can we do that? Let's study together...

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# <u>LESSON #10 = Loving Sexually: Love In Your Marriage</u>

<u>Introduction</u>: We cannot talk about love without discussing sex. The Bible has a lot to say about sex. Sex was/is God's idea! Therefore, His Word is the best manual for a class on sexuality. The purpose of this lesson is to present the biblical Christian view of human sexuality which is reserved for married couples. What do we know about God's view of sex? Let's study together...

#### **Discussion**:

# I. God's Original Plan Included Sex

We were created with equality (Genesis 1:27, Galatians 3:28, I Peter 3:7). We were created with diversity (Genesis 1:26-27, Psalm 33:20, 70:5, John 14:26). We were created for intimacy (Genesis 1:24-25, 28, 2:18-25, Matthew 19:4-6). How can we learn God's original plan for sex?

# II. God's People Had Sex

We were created for reproduction (Genesis 1:28, 5:1-32, 9:7, 11:10-26, Matthew 1:1ff). We were created for reflection (Genesis 1:26-27, 31, 2:18-25, 9:6, I Corinthians 11:7). We were created for relationships (Genesis 2:23-24, Matthew 19:5-6, Ephesians 5:31). Why do we need to pursue a godly approach to sexuality?

# III. God's Purpose Was Responsible Sex

Husbands are given specific commands (I Corinthians 7:3-5, Ephesians 5:25-28, 33, Colossians 3:19, I Peter 3:7).

Wives are given specific commands (I Corinthians 7:3-5, Ephesians 5:24, Colossians 3:18, I Peter 3:1-2).

Both are given specific commands not to separate (Matthew 19:6, Mark 10:9, I Corinthians 7:29), not to divorce (Matthew 5:31-32, Mark 10:2-12, Luke 16:18, Romans 7:2-3) and live in harmony with one another (I Peter 3:8, Romans 12:16). Why do you think people have perverted the image of sexuality?

<u>Conclusion</u>: Christians should avoid all forms of sexual sin (I Corinthians 6:19-20, Galatians 5:19-23, Ephesians 5:1-5, Colossians 3:5-6, I Thessalonians 4:3-7, Revelation 21:7-8). God's plan is good. God loves sex! He created it, and each of us, with a wholesome purpose but we've found all kinds of ways to be evil (Ecclesiastes 7:29). Let God's Word teach you what you need to know about sex (Hebrews 13:4, Song of Solomon). Let's pursue amazing love!



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# <u>LESSON #11 = Loving Financially: Love In Benevolence</u>

<u>Introduction</u>: God loves us! He is so good to us! He is the Greatest Giver! Loving and giving is inherent in His character. Christians are called to be like God. Are there some things we can learn from God? How can we give like God? How can we love financially? Let's study together...

#### **Discussion**:

I. God Thoughtfully Gives

II. God Freely Gives

<u>Conclusion</u>: **James 1:17** says, "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning." Think about how God gives. What if we give like Him? What if we love to give like God? Do you serve the Lord financially? Let's pursue amazing love!



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# <u>LESSON #12 = Loving Interracially: Love Without Prejudice</u>

<u>Introduction</u>: The Lord told many parables. Some of them show examples of Christian love. In **Luke 10:25-37** Jesus tells the story of the Good Samaritan. What does this story mean to you? We need to be searching for those who are crying out and help them! How can we love interracially? Let's study together...

#### **Discussion**:

I. Love Those Who Need A Friend

Psalm 102:3-7, Mark 15:36, Romans 12:15-16, I Corinthians 12:24-26 How can we love people who need a friend?

II. Love Those Who Need A Family

Luke 2:49, John 7:35, Matthew 12:46-50, Ephesians 2:19, Ephesians 1:5, Galatians 4:5, Romans 8:15, Romans 8:23, Romans 9:4

How can we love people who need a family?

III. Love Those Who Need Forgiveness

Luke 17:3-4, Matthew 18:35, Matthew 6:12, Luke 15:18-19, Luke 18:13, Galatians 6:1-2, Matthew 9:10-13

How can we love people who need forgiveness?

IV. Love Those Who Need A Future

Matthew 13:22, Luke 8:14, I Corinthians 13:13, II Corinthians 5:4, I John 3:16-18, Hebrews 12:12-13, Matthew 28:18-20, Mark 16:15-16 How can we love people who need a future?

<u>Conclusion</u>: God loves you! Remember the story of the Good Samaritan in **Luke 10:25-37** when you encounter people in need. What separated the Good Samaritan from the others? **Ephesians 5:1-2** says, "You are God's children whom he loves, so try to be like him. Live a life of love just as Christ loved us and gave himself for us as a sweet-smelling offering and sacrifice to God." People are looking for someone to love them and accept them. What will you do about it? Are you ready to love all people? Let's pursue this amazing love!
